Fourth Funders' Forum for the Systematic Observations Financing Facility (SOFF)

28 October 2021

Summary of the Chairperson

I. Introduction

- The fourth meeting of the forum of potential funders for the SOFF was convened virtually by the World Meteorological Organization (WMO), the United Nations Development Program (UNDP) and the United Nations Environmental Programme (UNEP) on 28 October 2021, 12:00-14:00h CEST.
- 2. Delegations from 27 potential funders attended the meeting. In addition, fourteen delegations from SOFF stakeholder organizations participated, including from beneficiary countries, members of the Alliance for Hydromet Development, the CSO community and scientific and technical SOFF partners. WMO, UNDP and UNEP leadership and staff joined the meeting. Johannes Linn, SOFF Global Facilitator, chaired the event. (See the list of participants in Annex I).
- 3. WMO Secretary-General Prof Petteri Taalas, UNEP Executive Director Inger Andersen and UNDP Administrator Achim Steiner welcomed the participants, thanked them for their engagement with SOFF and exhorted potential funders to finance SOFF as a foundational initiative in support of resilient development and climate action. The Chair reminded participants of the many strong voices of support which they had heard over the first three forums from many leaders representing stakeholders, including from recipient countries, from multilateral partners, from the private sector and from the CSO community.
- 4. The purpose of the meeting was to brief the participants on recent decisions taken by the World Meteorological Congress; present the final SOFF Terms of Reference Report; give potential funders an opportunity to make indicative statements about their intention to contribute to SOFF; and to address the way forward to a high-level SOFF announcement event at COP26 on 3 November 2021 and for the subsequent start-up of SOFF. The agenda for the meeting was structured accordingly (See Annex II).

II. Presentations

- 5. Anthony Rea, Director of the WMO Infrastructure Department, and Lars Peter Riishojgaard, Director of the WMO Earth Science Branch, explained the significance of the three interlinked decisions taken by the World Meteorological Congress in October 2021. The main aspects highlighted in their presentations included the following (see links to all slide presentations and the final Terms of Reference in Annex III):
 - i. The three decisions were on (a) WMO unified data policy, with a commitment of national governments to exchange certain data for certain purpose(s); (b) the Global Basic Observing Network (GBON), with regulatory material on the specifics of data exchange (what, when, where, how); and (c) the SOFF, requesting WMO in collaboration with UNDP and UNEP to pursue the creation of SOFF as a UN Multi-Partner Trust Fund (UN MPTF) as a matter of urgency as well as urging developed countries Members to financially contribute to the SOFF UN MPTF, to provide peer-to-peer support for the implementation of SOFF, or to provide any other form of support.
 - ii. These three decisions together represent a historic step by WMO towards global exchange of observations. They are critical to ensure that the upstream elements of the hydromet value chain support the downstream provision of reliable information for effective decision making and action on early warning and resilient development.
- 6. Lorena Santamaria from the WMO Development Partnerships Office presented the final SOFF Terms of Reference. She thanked delegations for their active engagement in shaping the design of the Facility over the preceding two years. The Terms of Reference will be appended to the Memorandum of Understanding to be signed by WMO, UNDP, UNEP and UNMPTF. They thus represent the basis for the

- creation of SOFF. The Terms of Reference also serve to inform countries, potential funders and stakeholders about the core elements of the Facility. Ms Santamaria explained the principal changes from the draft presented at the Third Funders' Forum, including advancements in (i) governance and complementarities, (ii) approaches to gender, and work with CSOs and the private sector; and (iii) the SOFF First Implementation Period.
- 7. Markus Repnik, Director of WMO Development Partnerships, informed participants about the next steps to get SOFF off the ground. He noted that at the COP26 SOFF announcement event on 3 November 2021, there will be an opportunity for high-level officials from funder countries and organizations to make a public announcement of their pledges or statements of support. It will also be the occasion of the formal signing of the Memorandum of Understanding legally creating SOFF. He reminded participants of the ambitious action program for the six-month SOFF Start Up Period, which includes the creation of the SOFF Secretariat and leads up to the first meeting of the SOFF Steering Committee planned for June 2022. He noted that funders who pledge financial support to SOFF before the first Steering Committee meeting will be able to jointly decide the final governance and operational modalities to be agreed at that meeting. Subsequent to the first Steering Committee meeting, SOFF operations will begin.

III. Discussion and Statements

- 8. Delegates congratulated WMO for the outcome of the World Meteorological Congress. They welcomed the quality of the SOFF Terms of Reference report and of the presentations, which indicate that SOFF represents an important, innovative and well-articulated initiative. Some delegates endorsed the inclusion of a gender action plan in the Terms of Reference, others noted the importance of ensuring sustainability of the SOFF mechanism, while yet others stressed the importance of complementarity with other initiatives such as REAP and CREWS.
- 9. The representative of the Least Developed Countries Group (LDCs) noted his group's strong support for SOFF. The LDCs reiterated the importance of having voice and vote at the Steering Committee. The SOFF team noted that management practices for global UN Multi-Partner Trust Funds call for only funders and the founding UN organization (in the case of SOFF, one of the three founding organizations, WMO) to have a vote on the Steering Committee, but the participation of the LDC Group and AOSIS as Steering Committee Members with voice will ensure that the views of LDCs and SIDS are properly reflected in SOFF decisions.
- 10. The Chairperson invited potential funder delegations to indicate their authorities' support for SOFF in various ways, from firm or conditional pledges to more general statements of support. He noted that authorities of potential funder countries and organizations are at different stages in the consideration of their possible support for SOFF. He also reminded delegations that the fourth funders' forum and the indicative statements are not the end of the process of resource mobilization for SOFF. Since the aim is to raise USD 200 million for the first three years of SOFF operations, it will be necessary to establish a broad base of funders willing to provide SOFF with the necessary means to achieve its ambitious and essential goal.
- 11. Seventeen potential funder delegations expressed their strong support for SOFF. They stated that their authorities are preparing to pledge, are considering ways of supporting SOFF, and/or endorsing the establishment of the SOFF while exploring possible future financial engagement. Some indicated their readiness to announce their intention to contribute financially to SOFF at the COP26 SOFF event on 3 November 2021.

IV. Closing

12. In his closing statement, the WMO Secretary-General thanked all participants for their interest and statements of support, and for their very helpful inputs throughout the SOFF preparation process. He emphasized again that WMO is fully committed to make SOFF a success and that it is working hard, in collaboration with UNDP, UNDP and the UNMPTF Office, to put in place all the arrangements needed

so that SOFF can be established as speedily as possible. The Chairperson delivered a provisional summary of the event. He closed the meeting by thanking especially the delegates for their engagement in the SOFF process and for the statements indicating expected pledges and other support. He thanked the SOFF team at WMO, UNDP and UNEP, and all those who made this event possible working behind the scenes, including the interpreters.
